



Make sure your drive finds the fairway on this difficult opening hole. A drive right will leave an approach blocked by trees. An approach from the fairway bunker on the left is no bargain either. Good Luck!



The second provides little relief from the difficult first. This domed fairway repels tee shots left towards OB and right towards the hazard. The green is severely sloped from right to left. Being below the hole is especially important here to have a makeable birdie putt.






379 - 353 **298 - 250** Par 4

This straight forward, uphill par 4 favors a draw off the tee that can carry all the bunkers into the widest part of the fairway. Once again, flanks the left side of the hole. A good drive leaves a short approach and a good birdie opportunity.



This medium length par 3 with small green usually plays in a left to right crosswind. The green slopes severely from back to front with a ridge bisecting the green. Club selection is key to be on the correct tier depending on the pin location










The sixth hole is another par four in which position off the tee is more important than length. The more aggressive tee shot is played towards a narrow neck of fairway, a water hazard and a bunker. This green is relatively flat especially in the center. Beware of the back left pin placement!

Medium length Par 3 with a green that tends to break more than the player anticipates. The trees on the left block the breeze, but a high tee shot will be greatly affected by the wind. The back right pin placement presents the biggest challenge to the player

The first of two par fives on the course plays further then the listed yardage because the second and third shots play severely uphill. With two superb shots the green can be reachable in two. Those laying up and going for the green in three shots have to be weary of the bunker short and right of the green and the grove of trees on the left about 100 yards out that seemingly swallows balls.... Let it rip!




The only true dogleg on the course closes up the front nine. The tee shot should be played straight out at the bunker through the fairway. Players need to hit the tee shot far enough past the corner to have an unobstructed approach to the green. Careful — This hole can be a real killer to front 9 scores!






The second and last par 5 on the course can be reached in two with two good shots. Any drive left of the cart path will kick towards out of bounds and the bunkers on the right aren't a bargain either. Water pinches the approach on both sides making a lay up shot difficult. The best place to putt on this extremely sloping green is from the middle of the green.







Club Selection is crucial as this green is fifty yards long. No matter where the pin is on the green it is very important to be below the hole. 3 Putts are very common on this green.






The tee shot should be a lay up placed in the fairway to avoid the bunkers right and the hazard left. This hole should yield many birdies and is one of the easiest on the course. The green once again slopes back to front.








A slight fade of the tee is the preferred trajectory. The player must avoid the fairway bunker on the left, and an errant tee shot right can leave a second shot blocked out by trees. Multiple fairway bunkers protect the most narrow green on the course.








Another fade off the tee is beneficial on this slight dog leg right. A long hitter can attempt to carry the bunker on the right of the tee, leaving a short wedge into the green. Beware of OB along the whole left side and behind the green. The green is quite possibly the most difficult on the course.








The shortest hole on the course, an iron or hybrid off the tee will leave an easy wedge shot into the shallow green which is bisected by a steep ridge in the middle. An aggressive play with the driver can leave a pitch shot onto the green. However, depending on the pin location this may leave a tricky shot onto this ever-sloping green.



Welcome to the Final Charge! A three hole stretch of extremely challenging golf. OB Left and a deep fairway bunker right makes this a very narrow and nervous tee shot. The second shot is played to an uphill green guarded by bunkers on both sides. The green slopes from both sides to the middle and back to front. Par is a very good score here.






Par 3

This is the Bridges signature hole. Many rounds are ruined on this dangerous par 3 with a carry over water. The hole plays slightly downhill and is highly exposed to wind. If the pin is on the plateau on the front right, Good Luck!

Par 4

The closing hole is the longest par 4 on the course and also plays predominately into a prevailing wind. A good drive will avoid the fairway bunker left and the trees right. The back pin location requires precise distance control to avoid the deep bunker short of the green. A front or middle pin will make the player hit into the narrowest portions of the green.
